Annual General Meeting

As well as invited guests from South Frontenac Council we will be welcoming a special guest speaker, Mark Badham, curator of the Geology Museum in Miller Hall at Queen's University. Most Buck Lakers are aware of Pulpit Rock. Plan to attend on Saturday and find out why such formations are referred to as a metasedimentary block...a Calc-silicate rock formation known as sugar loaf.

The business meeting will include financial, activities and initiatives reports as well as the election of Directors for the next term. We also have a considerable supply of material from the Docktalk 2006 program available for members who are interested. We plan to take care of business but also provide the opportunity for members to share concerns and interact with each other for the good of out lake. Please plan to attend if possible.



Please Note: Due to the change of our membership term to a calendar year, renewals are not necessary until December, however we will be prepared to welcome new memberships as well as renew memberships for 2008 for those who wish to do so at the AGM.

Nominations Committee Report to AGM - 2007

Clause 8 a i of the Association's By-law 1 indicates that the Board of Directors will consist of not fewer than 9, and not more than 12, members. The 2006-2007 Board had 12 members.

Clause 8 a ii of By-law 1 indicates that a Board

member may not serve for more than 6 consecutive years. In keeping with this restriction Amy Rossworm will retire at this AGM.

This same sub clause indicates that Board members are to be elected to serve for 2-year terms of office, to a maximum of 3 terms.

A number of the 2006-2007 Board members will not be available for service commencing with the 2007 AGM for a variety of reasons ranging from ineligibility to health to business pressures. Those not available are Bruce Barnes, Nancy Daugulis, Jim Manuel, Marilyn O'Connor, and Jan Theoret to whom we say "thank you" for past services rendered.



Directors Crawford MacIntyre, Roy Mills, Stephen Roughton and Duncan Sinclair were elected for their second 2 year terms at the 2006 AGM.

Director Maxine Lemieux was elected to her initial 2 year term at the 2006 AGM.
