Reg Genge, of Ontario Lake Assessments, who is working on our water quality report, will be presenting some preliminary findings at the AGM on July fourth (instead of at the educational session). This talk will be of great interest to anyone who has wondered how our water quality has changed over the years. Also at the AGM the Friends of the Lake committee will be selling 18"x 24" topographical maps of Buck Lake, including features such as streams, islands, buildings, crown land, surrounding watershed and local landmarks. The map will cost \$15 and you can reserve one by emailing Barb Perry at barbperry@sympatico.ca. We've seen a sample and they are beautiful!

Those Lovely Loons

One can't be on or near Buck Lake for more than a few minutes without being aware of our majestic loons. They add a critical identity to the lake and our enjoyment of it. **Bird Studies Canada** is conducting the Canadian Lakes Loon Survey and is asking for volunteers to help with the project. The Common Loon is the most numerous of the four species that breed in Canada and the majority of the world's population breed in our lakes. The Loon Study has been collecting data since 1981 and reports that although overall populations of the Common Loon are stable in Canada, the reproductive rates in

Eastern Canada are consistently lower due to water quality (lower pH levels, Type E Botulism etc.), shoreline development, water level fluctuations and increased numbers

of watercraft. If you would like more information on the Canadian Loon Survey or would like to be part of the project, go to www.birdscanada.org or contact Bird Studies Canada at P.O. Box 160, Port Rowan, ON, NOE 1MO.

On the Loon theme, the Frontenac Stewardship Council is sponsoring a Loon Workshop in Sharbot Lake on Saturday June 27th. The location will be the Oso Township Hall in the heart of



Sharbot Lake Village and at the Anglican Church Meeting Room, just across the parking lot. The program begins at 9:00 a.m. and wraps up at 3:45 p.m. There will be speakers, resources and displays of nesting platforms etc. One of the keynote speakers is Kathy Jones from the Canadian Loon Survey. It sounds like an excellent opportunity to learn and network on an interesting and important part of our lake.

- If you have been following developments on the amendments to Ontario's 141 year-old Mining Act, check out the FOCA website at www.foca.on.ca. FOCA has represented on the Ministers Mining Act Advisory Committee throughout the process of review and amendment.  an estimated 1800 cyclists could participate creating quite challenging traffic
 conditions along the Perth Road. Perth Road Crafters and Firefighters are

 and take precautions on the highway as needed.
