Board of Director's Report

The Board met on Saturday May 10th and a summary of agenda items and discussion follows:

- Crawford MacIntyre reported on the plan to present a CPR Training Course in May of 2010. Mark Halliday is prepared to offer a four hour course at a cost of \$35/person. Final details will be determined and an announcement will be made in the April Newsletter and by separate email notice as needed.
- Ralph Wirsig reported that membership renewals for 2010 have reached 111 with more expected as seasonal members get back into the Lake routine. Newsletter advertising revenue has shown a positive increase for the new fiscal year and may exceed \$700 (update: we are at \$825).
- Saundra Rider reported on behalf of the Community Outreach/Social Committee and proposed dates for a number of upcoming events ...Spring Pot Luck at Margaret Fisher's will be June 10th, Boatilla 2010 is planned for July 3rd to not conflict with the AGM on July 10th this year. The tentative date for the Annual BBQ/Picnic is Saturday August 21st.
- Wayne Myles reported on behalf of Friends of the Lake/Lake Planning.
 Wayne shared a copy of Reg Genge's report "A Summary and Critical Review of the Water Quality



of Buck Lake". This report prepared for the BLA will provide the benchmark for our future information gathering and action. A communication plan for sharing this report with our members will be a primary focus of Year Two activities. The Friends of the Lake are investigating partnerships with other lake associations who are currently in a planning process or have completed the planning process and are in the implementation and maintenance stages. The Friends are planning to present an update at the AGM as well as holding an information seminar for members on July 15th. Wayne also reported that the sale of the second printing of the Buck Lake Map has covered costs and about 100 copies remain for sale this summer. He also noted that the FOCA Lake Planning Handbook has been an excellent resource to the Committee.

- Crawford MacIntyre reported that the Government Relations Committee is
 planning to make a presentation to Township Council in May to highlight our
 concerns regarding parking, maintenance and traffic speed at the Causeway as
 well as the impact of the new Waste Management Plan and its impact on our
 members.
- A number of additional items discussed at the Board are included as information in this issue of the News.

Reg Genge's report addresses water quality in great detail. The following are exerts from his report. More details will be included in future issues.

The parameters of primary interest with respect to human impacts on water quality are the lake trophic status parameters. These include water clarity (Secchi disc depths), chlorophyll a, total phosphorus (TP), total nitrogen (TN), TN:TP ratios and oxygen concentrations in the hypolimnion (hypolimnion is the dense, bottom layer of water in a thermally-stratified lake. It is the layer that lies below the thermocline). As

such, these parameters received the greatest amount of sample effort over the period of record.

Lake sensitivity to water quality change is a function of flushing, dilution and assimilation capacity. Small lakes have less volume than large lakes and therefore less ability to dilute contaminants or nutrients.

Buck 'Lake' is really two distinct water bodies separated by a small stream. The north and south basins are different sizes and shapes with different watershed sizes and bedrock geology and overburden characteristics and therefore experience different water quality.

Cam McAuley of MNR has indicated that his department will be doing oxygen and temperature readings for Buck Lake during the months of June, July, August and the 1st couple of weeks in September this year.

Building a Floating Loon Nesting Platform

Using the design and instructions found at http://www.rideau-info.com/local/loon-nest.html I recently built and launched on 2010 April 2, with help from 4 grand daughters, an artificial loon nesting platform to a location east from the osprey nest at



the south end of the south branch. Note the ice still lingering at the shoreline behind the platform. While I hope a pair of loons will find and use the nest, from what I read it may take a year or more for that to happen. And even then there is no guarantee it will work especially considering the location, while in/beside a

water lily patch, is less than ideal with respect to remoteness from boat traffic. To all who now know where this new landmark is you may wish to cautiously join in the



'watching what happens' from a respectful distance. The nesting period (including about 4 weeks for gestation) runs between about mid May to end June.


I choose the PVC nest platform design over a cedar log design to avoid water logging and having to pull the heavy log platform out every year. Note the impressive "Nest Diary" of the PVC platform recorded on the web site noted above.

At a loon seminar last summer it was stated that for a lake like Buck Lake the loon's worst enemy is the

raccoons to whom loon's eggs are a delicacy and whose population proliferates from food sources they find around humans. The message is take care to avoid raccoon access to all food sources including using effective safeguards around bird feeders. And floating nest platforms can be an effective defense against raccoons.

CPR Training Course

Your Board of Director's has arranged for Mark Halliday to conduct two CPR training courses for members on two evenings in May. As outlined the October 2009 News, the chance of saving a life rises dramatically if appropriate techniques are used quickly...with the emphasis on quickly. Since many of us live year round on the Lake, this is especially relevant as immediate professional help in a cardiac emergency, as an example, is simply not available.

We hope a number of our members will take advantage of this opportunity. Up to 10 places are available for each four hour training sessions. The techniques employed are quite different and better than those we might have learned in the past. Mark will instruct on the following topics:

- CPR for children over one year of age and adults
- Treatment of conscious and unconscious patients
- How to use a defibrillator
- How to use a pocket mask

- Review of heart attacks, stokes and allergic reactions
- A review of the Emergency Medical Services system

The training will take place at Perth Road United Church Hall on the evenings of Monday May 17th and Wednesday May 26th from 6:00 to 10:00 p.m. Choose the evening that is best for you and contact Crawford MacIntyre at (613) 273-8056 or email cmac@rideau.net. 
