President's Message

Greetings from Fortress Toronto.

Many of you know that I am spending a fair amount of time in Toronto these days working on an exciting program to reduce costs in our hospitals. I have been enjoying the privilege of traveling back and forth between my home at Buck Lake and a small apartment in downtown Toronto. While in Toronto, I have access to the best of city living. At home, I have Buck Lake and Buck Lakers.

This has all changed recently as Toronto prepares to host the G20 Summit. I know you have all heard the stories of how much money is being spent to prepare, of the fake lake and other apparent excesses in the plans so I will not repeat these here. Instead, I thought you would be interested to hear what it is like to be working in downtown Toronto as this event unfolds.



I work out of One Dundas, a building that is part of the Eaton

Centre. Right across Yonge St. is Dundas Square. Organizers anticipate that this will be the site where protestors gather before heading down Yonge St to approach the security fence. In preparation, Yonge St has been stripped of anything that a protestor might be able to pick up and throw. Garbage cans have been replaced by plastic bags tied to hydro poles. Mailboxes have vanished. Restaurateurs and other shopkeepers have been advised that they cannot have anything on the sidewalk in front of their premises. The street looks naked.

Our landlord has told us that the building will be under special security for the week. We are advised to carry Government Issue identification with us at all times in order to avoid the risk of arrest. We are also advised to dress casual and not carry our laptop computers with us so we can blend into the crowd.

Many downtown businesses are giving their employees the week off and shutting down. We have plans that will allow us to continue to serve our member hospitals, many of whom are on high alert, while also closing our offices at least on Friday.

All this is meant to protect the city from the protestors and, perhaps the protestors from themselves. The delegates to the summit will be safe and sound inside the fence.

It certainly reminds one that we are blessed to have access to the peacefulness of life at Buck Lake.

I wish you all a healthy, happy summer 2010. See you at the AGM on July 10th.

Clause 8 a i of the Association's By-law 1 indicates that the Board of Directors will consist of not fewer than 9, and not more than 12 members. The 2009-2010 board had 12 members.

Clause 8 a ii of By-law 1 indicates that a board member may not serve more than 6 consecutive years. The same sub clause indicates the members are to be elected to

serve for 2 year terms of office, to a maximum of 3 terms.

At the 2009 AGM directors Peter Dawe and Cheryl Savery were elected to their first two year term; directors Nancy Daugulis, Anna Fummerton, Wayne Myles, Saundra Rider and Ralph Wirsig were elected to their second two year term; and President Tricia Waldron was elected to her third two year term.

Maxine Lemieux and Stephen Roughton have declined re-nomination for a third two year term thereby making it possible to nominate two new Buck Lake Association members to serve their initial two year term on the BLA board.

The Nominating Committee nominates

Maureen McLellan and Ross Trudel for election to their initial 2 year term at the 2010

AGM. Each nominee has agreed to serve if elected.

The Nominating Committee nominates Crawford McIntyre and Roy Mills for election to third 2 year term at the 2010 AGM. Each nominee has agrees to serve if elected.

The above four nominees, plus the eight continuing directors elected at the 2009 AGM will result in the 2010-2011 Board of Directors having the maximum allowable total of twelve directors.

If there are nominations from the floor at this AGM a ballot election will be held if the total number of nominees standing for office exceeds four.

Board of Director's Report

The Board met on June 12th 2009 and considered a wide range of topics:

- Director Stephen Roughton reported that the Nominating Committee was searching for two new Directors for the next Board and that a report would be ready for the next Newsletter.
- Secretary-Treasurer Cheryl Savery presented a brief financial report and stated that the 2009 Financial Statement would be presented for approval at the AGM as well as a mid-year financial update for members.
- Director Ralph Wirsig amended our 2009 membership year-end number to 161, an all time high. 2010 renewals stand at 115 with many more expected in the next few weeks and at the AGM.

 Members were asked to notify the BLA at <u>info@bucklake.ca</u> if they should change their email addresses so we can reduce the bounce backs on the Newsletter

electronic distribution.

 The logistics of AGM planning was a major discussion and a tentative agenda will be published in the June Newsletter.

- The Friends of the Lake Committee reported that they had been informed that a grant of \$1500 from the MNR has been received for wildlife habitat studies this summer.
- Director Crawford MacIntyre reported on the BLA presentation to the South Frontenac Council on June 1st. The main focus was safety at the Causeway...speed limits, parking and signage. Cell phone and broadband services were also addressed. He

also reported that Mark Segsworth, Township Engineer/Works Department Manager was planning a public meeting to discuss planned upgrades to the Perth Road in the near future and that we would keep members informed of details.

- Director Saundra Rider reported for the Community Outreach/Social Committee and reported that approximately 40 members attended the Pot Luck Social at Margaret Fisher's home on June 10th. Plans are well underway for the Annual BBQ/Picnic on August 22nd and more detail will be printed in up-coming Newsletters.
- The Government Relations Committee was asked to prepare a recommendation regarding possible involvement of the BLA in municipal elections in the fall of 2010. This item will be discussed by the new Board in August.
- Director Nancy Daugulis presented a proposal to involve all members in the collection of reflections and memories of life on Buck Lake for the History Project. She will prepare an item for the next Newsletter.
- Director Roy Mills reported that due to a back order of markers only 4 shoal markers were in place. More would be in place in the next week and another

dozen were on order. The challenge now was to ask lake residents to "adopt" a marker and have the BLA support the program with supplies and assistance as required.

The Board will next meet following the AGM to set a date for the August meeting.

Friends of the Lake Report

The Friends of the Lake Committee met on 27 May. Most of the meeting was devoted to

discussion of how best to proceed to the development of a draft lake plan for consideration first by the BLA Board and then by the membership. The Committee is using guidelines prepared by FOCA (Federation of Ontario Cottage Associations). Currently work is underway on the drafting of a vision statement. putting together information on Buck Lake and its watershed, preparing an introduction to the history of Buck Lake and its community, completion of Reg Genge's water quality report, expansion of a loon study, and follow up with the Ministry of Natural Resources on their studies of lake trout and shore fish. There's a lot to do!

Volunteers are needed for two projects:

LOON STUDY - Kathy Wirsig is coordinating a survey of the nesting, hatching and successful rearing of loons in the several parts of Buck Lake. We need two volunteers to survey this summer the loon population in the north end of the south branch and the south end of the north branch; three observations are to be made - of pairs of loons nesting, their success in hatching young ones, and again later in the season of the success of those chicks to the stage where they can fish and fly on their own. If you would be willing to take on this responsibility for 2010, please contact Kathy (k.wirsig@gmail.com) by return e-mail and I will put you in touch with Kathy.

FISH STUDY BY THE MNR - we have been advised that Cam McCauley (MNR) has been funded for studies of the temperature and oxygen concentration in the deep lake trout "holes" and for netting and tagging spawning trout in the fall. Two volunteers with good-sized boats (a pontoon boat or large open boat larger than 14 ft in length) are need to transport Cam and an assistant plus their gear to two or three sites on the south branch and one site on the north branch sometime in July or August (probably the latter). Please contact me and I will provide more detail just as soon as I have it.

WILDLIFE SURVEY - Cam has also been funded to train volunteers to conduct a standardized wildlife survey – loons (see Loon Study note above), marsh inhabitants, song birds, turtles, and owls. If you would be willing to participate in this survey, again please contact me and I will let you know when the training session will be as soon as I have that information.

Finally, the Committee confirmed that Reg Genge will be the speaker once again at the Buck Lake AGM to be held Saturday morning, 10 July. More details can be found elsewhere in this newsletter.



A Matter of Interest for Fishermen

Oxygen concentrations are of course critical to the survival of lake trout. Optimal conditions for lake trout are waters with a temperature < 10 *C with oxygen concentrations > 6.0 mg/L. Lake trout can exist in less than optimal conditions at temperatures below 15.4 *C and at oxygen concentrations > 4.0 mg/L. Lake trout populations become confined to a narrow layer in the late summer due to warming of the surface waters and due to oxygen depletion in the bottom waters.

The following chart is a summary of the "numbers" from Reg Genge's report and only 2 parameters do not meet current standards; the volume weighted hypolimnion oxygen

concentration and total phosphorous.
