Municipal Election Survey

Buck Lake lies within three Districts of South Frontenac: Bedford, Loughborough and Storrington. The Buck Lake Association forwarded a simple, direct question to every candidate in each District, including candidates for the Boards of Education. We received 10 replies from the 17 candidates we contacted with the following question:

Why are you running for office in 2010 and what are the goals you hope to achieve during your term if successful?

Candidates for Mayor

Gary Davison

As a lifelong resident of South Frontenac, I have a deep-rooted commitment and concern for the well-being and betterment of our community. I have enjoyed being involved in many organizations and committees at every level in the past through coaching baseball and hockey, serving 40 years with South Frontenac Fire Department (8 years as Fire Chief), as a member of the Sydenham 496 Legion, and the Sydenham Lions Club. All of this, plus my seven years on Council has brought me in contact with many people in South Frontenac. This allows me to be able to appreciate the needs of many constituents. In addition, my contacts within our senior governments have assisted South Frontenac in successfully receiving funding for infrastructure projects.

As Mayor, I am committed to working together with all members of Council to find realistic solutions to create a healthier community and to create a more sustainable world for our children and grandchildren. My ability to build consensus and encourage healthy, productive discussions at Council, while respecting the opinions of others on Council and within our community, will be at the forefront of every decision I make as Mayor.

Candidates for Council

Del Stowe – Bedford District

I am running for councilor in Bedford District because I can provide knowledge and experience to the new council. I have 10 years experience as a councilor of South Frontenac and was the Chief Building Official of Bedford and then South Frontenac. I also know what it means to be part of a team. This important attribute is something that will be required under our newly amalgamated Township. No longer will two votes out of three for district issues



exist. Councilors will now be required to work with other districts to get the required votes needed to pass motions. This is a glorious opportunity that I wish to be part of since I have always been able to compromise and negotiate for what is best for Bedford and just as importantly now, South Frontenac.

I also want council to review our present committees and especially the Committee of Adjustment. I received many complaints about this committee due to its inconsistency. This may be a result of its size and composition. It is presently 8 members of which four are councilors. This often results in "political decisions" based on constituents. I would like to see it reduced to one councilor and one public member for each district. Also, the zoning by-law will have to be reviewed in the new term of council, and my career as a supervisor of permits for the City of Kingston has given me a great understanding of zoning by-laws and their use in both protecting our lakes and on development within the Township.

I will also be a strong voice ensuring that Bedford will not be reduced from two representatives as was tried by some of the councilors or by having election at large. I will keep supporting the Private Lane Assistance Plan for road maintenance and the five year road plan both of which I am proud to have been a part of and I will continue to support the Septic re-inspection program.

In conclusion, I feel I have a lot to offer the residents of Bedford and South Frontenac with my experience as a councilor and as a full time municipal employee and have developed great working relationships with staff and council and would like the opportunity to continue to do so. My family roots date back to the 1850's at which time my ancestors settled in the Perth Road Village area. At this time I feel I would make a very knowledgeable and competent Councillor for the Township.

Beneficial Attributes/Commitments

- Honesty, Integrity, Transparency and Fair Treatment to "all" residents of the Municipality.
- Vast experience in the Road, Bridge and Water and Sewer construction industry while working for contractors and engineers, I have personally managed over 80 million dollars worth of projects in the last 2 years.
- I vow to have a common sense approach to development within the Township, keeping in mind that development creates revenue and jobs which in the end will prove beneficial to all residents of our community while striving to maintain our rural quality of life.

 handling our waste.

Fran Willes - Loughborough District

Very briefly, I have a number of concerns about the direction that Council has taken in the past with respect to long-range planning for development, and the effect that these decisions might have on our lakes. In particular, the present Council has failed to recognize that new technologies concerning sewerage treatment have been developed to protect the ground water and water quality in our lakes. These should be utilized wherever new development takes place adjacent to water bodies. Protection of the water quality of Sydenham Lake is essential.

Another concern is overspending: Council has spent over \$8 million of a \$10 million budget at the end of August. If Council continues spending at the same rate, there will be a \$2 million deficit by the end of December. The assessment base in Loughborough District, especially with respect to waterfront properties, has been increased enormously. In my opinion, mill rates should not have risen in the recent past, but should have gone down. Instead, the present Council has simply spent the additional tax revenues on non-essential undertakings.

Ron Vandewal – Loughborough District

I am running because I feel I can make a difference in our local communities. I have the knowledge and conviction to make some difficult decisions and I love this community as a place to live and raise a family. It is great place to live.

We need to better manage Waste Disposal and make it easier to divert more from landfills. We need to see how we can broaden our tax base to try and keep tax increase to a minimum. Strong discussions on budgets are needed. Keep the level of Road Construction to try and maintain what we have without going backwards and we need a long- term plan on the repair and rebuilding of fire halls.

Peter Roos – Storrington District

Board of Director's Report

The Board met on Saturday September 25th at the call of our President Tricia Waldron. The minutes of our inaugural meeting of August 7th 2010 were presented and approved. Crawford MacIntyre reported that Ross Trudel had served notice of his intention to resign from the Board. The Constitution allows for an appointment by the Board but the Nominating Committee is not ready to make a recommendation at this time. We will proceed with a Board of 11 Directors for the present.

Secretary-Treasurer Cheryl Savery reported a current account balance of \$834.52 and a balance of \$8,507.18 in reserve funds. We are anticipating some rebates from the MNR for summer programs run by the Friends of the Lake as well as some late revenue from memberships and map sales. Membership as of

early September stood at 141, which is 20 under our 2009 year-end numbers. Saundra Rider expressed thanks to Directors and spouses for their support at the Annual Summer Picnic in August. The food was great, the music fantastic but the weather was a challenge. A motion was passed to invest in three tents similar to the tent we borrowed from Ross Trudel for the picnic and were so thankful for. The tents would be available for the use of members as well as the BLA for special functions in the future.

The Government Relations Committee recommended that the BLA prepare a survey for candidates as we have in the last two elections in the Township. A simple question was suggested and Roy Mills was asked to prepare a survey format and distribute it to candidates and the Directors by early October. Liz Whelpdale reported on behalf of the Friends of the Lake. The Friends are negotiating with the MNR for grant funds to cover some of the summer costs from seminars speakers and the Fish Netting Project. A group of the Friends will be beginning the writing phase of the Lake Plan this fall and planning for the 2011 projects.

They plan to access MNR grant sources in the new year as well.



Other Business:

- Crawford reported a possible conflict of dates for the CPR Course and he would keep those interested informed.
- Cheryl reported that we have placed 26 Shoal Markers and all have been assigned a "guardian" who will remove the ball before freeze up and attached a plastic jug for the winter. Thanks to all members for their interest and support.
- A number of Directors indicated their interest in attending the Lake Links 2010 Meeting in Perth on October 30th.

The Board will next meet on Saturday November 20th 2010.

Friends of the Lake Committee Report

The MNR will use some of the grant for the projects but BLA will still have enough for the budgeted items. A future newsletter article will have some information regarding the fish trap netting and counting done as well as oxygen and temperature readings as part of the MNR surveys this past summer. Yes summer is over and the fall begins with the change of leaf colour and the inevitable parachuting of the leaves to our yards for clean up. (Shredded leaves make good fertilizer if buried in the garden in the fall.)

There will be a workshop this fall or early winter re: training for volunteers around the MNR proposed surveys (Owl, marsh, bird). There may also be a Fish 101 information presentation with help from Cam (MNR) and a plan is in the making to present lake residents with an update on our work on the lake plan and various surveys such as secchi, oxygen/Temperature, tagging lake trout in north branch, and loon surveys. We anticipate that the draft outline of the lake plan will go to the Board this fall.

I will be filing and completing the Bird Studies Canada form this week. There was 1 loon chick born in early August + 4 adults recorded on North Buck Lake and 4 young chicks + 19 adults observed in August on South Buck branch. There appears to be an increase in duck and goslings sightings on the Lake this year but thankfully no cormorants.

Broadband News

On August 31st, the EOWC (Eastern Ontario Wardens' Caucus) announced an agreement with Bell Aliant and Bell to construct a core backbone fibre network throughout Eastern Ontario which will enable 95% of the region to access next generation high speed internet service. The construction of the new network will take place in stages over the next two years. Barrett Xplore Inc was selected to provide satellite services to remote and terrain challenging locations. Through the Canada Building Fund, \$110 million will be contributed by the Federal and Provincial Governments with the balance of the estimated \$170 million cost being contributed by Bell and the municipalities of Eastern Ontario. - Blue-green algae has been reported in the Rideau system on Dog Lake. If you were at the AGM in July, you will remember photos showing how devastating this algae can be. Visible algae blooms may produce toxins and using the water for cooking, drinking or
- bathing could be dangerous. Boiling the water with the algae only produces more toxins.
- Shoal Markers will be slowly retired to volunteers' cottages and garages over the next few weeks. We plan to leave the anchors and chains in the water and use a plastic bleach or water jug to mark the location for the winter. We will assess the durability of the red markers after a summer in the water and supply replacement materials and assistance in the spring as needed. Thanks again to all who encouraged and supported the effort this summer.
