Update Notes on Outboard Motor Emissions

Some good things do come of modern progress and even from our government. As an update to part of the Lake Plan published a few years back, now it should be noted that in regards to outboard motors, modern two strokes of some manufacturers are not the polluters they were in the past. High pressure direct inject technologies used in the Envinrude line and some of the Tohatsu line, meet even the most stringent of pollution regulations of the California air quality agency, CARB, (namely the 3 Star ultra low emissions rating). Four stroke engines have been, and continue to be, low emission engines.

The Canadian government passed legislation in 2011 to work in conjunction with the US EPA so that all motors imported or manufactured in Canada meet emission standards that are not unlike what we know of for our automobiles in Ontario – i.e. regulating the output of Nitrous Oxides, Carbon Monoxides and other emissions. The emissions regulations are evolving and are more stringent for subsequent production years, but the take away is that anyone who is considering the retirement of their ``old smoker`` should be confident that any outboard sold in Canada since production year 2012 is the cleanest that is available. For engines under 15 hp it should be noted that the Lehr ``propane`` out boards are a very good option and represent new forward enviro thinking, and of course there are electric options.

That all being as it is, I must say that some of our most rewarding times on the waters of Buck Lake have been experienced in human powered vessels of some description or other.

I'm a BLA member and resident on the lake. I teach energy topics at St Lawrence College, and starting in September, I will be teaching a course on renewable energy design. I am looking for design projects for my students.



An ideal situation would be a cottage owner interested in

a solar power system, either to get off the grid or replace/supplement a gas generator. As many members will know, the cost of electricity for seasonal residents is quite high, especially when you consider all the fixed costs.

Solar Design and Feasibility Study for Your Cottage - Free!

St Lawrence College students in the Energy Systems Engineering Technology program are looking for a design project as part of a course on renewable energy design. What you get:

A very thorough feasibility study and design with 'ballpark' costs for a solar electric or solar hot

water system for your cottage. If you're on the grid now, you could consider disconnecting; or if you use a generator now, you could reduce or eliminate it.

If the results from the student's work seemed feasible to you, the next step would be to contact a local solar contractor – we would not be involved in supplying or installing equipment.


What we would need from you: Address of the property and permission to visit. A list of all the loads you want to power and the usage of each.
