Lake Water Level

A recent trip to the dam by a BLA member indicates that there is still one log in the dam and that the water is overflowing but not as much as usual.

Fortis Power operates the dam in cooperation with The Cataraqui Conservation Authority and Parks Canada. Fortis Power has indicated to us that Buck Lake is a very, very small source of water for their use. Parks Canada may draw on the water system if the Rideau Canal is low. However, Fortis would have to adjust the dam level for Parks Canada. The Rideau Canal system is fed from so many systems that any water from Buck Lake would be rather insignificant.

The watershed feeding Buck Lake is 61.34 square kilometers and the area of Buck Lake is 6.96 square kilometers. Many small streams, creeks etc. feed into Buck Lake from the 61.34 square kilometers of watershed. If there is an interruption of this feed from some source or sources, it can affect the level of the lake.



In the fall, which we are approaching, the level of Buck Lake is lowered to accommodate fish spawning. If the level went too low, this could affect the ability of fish to spawn in their normal spawning areas.

Apart from these items, I am not sure if the lake is below the minimum established for level control or not.

Mark Nicol, president of the BLA contacted Fortis and reported the following: Fortis is sending a team out to assess the situation at the dam and said they would not be lowering the water levels any further and would probably close the dam now.

Bricks and cement tiles have been placed at the boat launch off

Perth Road in an attempt to reduce the sudden rise to the concrete pad. It is our hope that the new township council will consider a more permanent solution once they are in their new jobs.


