Buck Lake's Community and Your Health

Most Canadians are proud of our healthcare 'system', thinking it among if not the best in the world. There is no doubt that when you are seriously sick or injured you have ready access, especially here in southeastern Ontario, to medical and hospital care that's first class. But let's not be complacent. Our federal Minister of Health, Jane Philpot, herself a physician, pointed out in a speech in Kingston a few months ago that when compared to nearly a dozen other highly developed countries, healthcare in Canada ranked second from the bottom, not the top. To rub salt in it she also pointed out we were paying more per capita than most – a new car cost for a ride in a beater. It is painfully apparent that healthcare, an icon of what it means to be Canadian, needs work.

Another thing that few Canadians know is that when it comes to optimizing the health of any population, healthcare services (hospitals, doctors, nurses, physiotherapists, the lot) contribute at most about 25%. For the most part the healthcare 'system' can be thought of as the equivalent of a transportation system's repair shops. Like designing new cars, ships, trains, roads, airports, and teaching people to drive, all vital to a transportation system, fully 75% of people's health is determined by the social environment in which they live. Having parents with good genes also helps but that influence pales when compared to the heavy-hitting power of the social determinants of health.

You will be asking, "what has all this to do with Buck Lake?" The answer is "quite a bit, actually" once you understand that one of the most powerful of the social determinants of health is a supportive, welcoming, and inclusive community. Some of the others are education, especially in early childhood, housing, financial and personal security, regular, useful, challenging work, and being in charge of your own destiny, but being surrounded by good friends and neighbours who offer mutual support in good times and bad is a really significant determinant of good health.

A welcoming, supportive, and inclusive community is what the Buck Lake Association is doing its best to support here in our little piece of paradise. That's why we are putting so much of our volunteer time, effort and energy into the social side of our mandate, trying to make it enjoyably possible for everybody on the lake, permanent and seasonal residents alike, to meet and get to

know everybody else. We all want to be healthy. Being part of and participating in a supportive Buck Lake community is an important way to get and stay that way.



Water Clarity – Secchi Disk Measurements

In March's newsletter, we reported on the total phosphorus measurements in the lake. This month, we take a look at the water clarity as measured at various locations in the lake.


While total phosphorus concentrations are the best way to describe the nutrient status of the lake, regular Secchi depths can help to identify changes in water clarity that are not linked to nutrient status (zebra mussels, climate change, etc.).




Secchi measurements are preformed by lowing a Secchi disk into the water until it is no longer visible, and then recording the depth of the disk.

As shown in the graphs below, the Secchi disk measurements have been gradually decreasing since 1996. This means that the water in the lake was becoming less clear. However in 2016, there was an increase in the clarity, particularly on the North Branch. The reasons for the improved clarity, however, are not clear.

The improved clarity may be related to the lower phosphorus levels in 2016, particularly on the North Branch.



The presence of zebra mussels can also result in increased clarity. As zebra mussels feed, they filter plant plankton from the water, making the water clearer, but not cleaner. As the sun is able to penetrate deeper into the lake, aquatic plants can take root in more extensive areas than they did before zebra mussels appeared. This is unlikely an issue on the North Branch where the calcium levels in the lake are too low to sustain zebra mussels. However, zebra mussels have been found throughout the southern end of the South Branch and may be having some impact on the water clarity.

Their families report major positive changes in social, emotional and mental well being as well as generating a new ability to look positively forward in their difficult lives.

Boatilla family for many years. He is in his second year of college. He loves to speak and hopes to be an announcer. He is delightful and humorous at our event. It wouldn't be the same without him.

Kierra is a young girl who was struggling and was very afraid of water. After her camp experience she is like a little tadpole and just loves to swim. She also has an amazing voice and has sang acapella for us at the Boatilla. Her choice of songs have been "Hear me roar" and "My Fight Song". — you can imagine the emotion generated by her beautiful voice.

Izzy came to the Boatilla in 2015 and was hoping to attend Camp Merrywood in the summer. She was very shy and very concerned about her wheelchair which provides her with the ability to move around. Our guys lifted her and her chair onto one of the pontoon boats and she was able to enjoy the boat parade and celebration barbecue.

There have been many Easter Seals children and families at the Boatilla. It is heartwarming to listen to their Camp stories and share their successes. One year they were offered Seadoo rides and they loved it. Their faces shone with joy and their voices were shouting with glee.

Chad and Kierra have gone on to be Ambassadors for Easter Seals. They are poised and accomplished young people.

I guess what I'm trying to say is that the Camp experience has been very enabling for the children. It gives them outdoor fun and recreation as well as self confidence and optimism and relationships with other campers and leaders. The Boatilla event is also very important to the campers and their families -- giving them a day outdoors and on the lake. Last year 11 Easter Seals Families joined the event!

Our Boatilla is an important event that our community has supported in a very big way. Last year there were over 40 boats that gathered at the boat launch and paraded around the lake.
