# **President's Message – Crawford MacIntyre**

It has been a remarkable period of weather this spring and summer. Our region is as lush and bountiful as I have seen in many years. Of course, this rainforest-like weather also brings with it sunken boats and uprooted docks around the lake. Our BLA Facebook page has been active with announcements of finding or losing items as they floated out and about the lake.

A Karen Landman and Ashlee Cunsole have co-edited a collection of essays in a book entitled *Mourning Nature: Hope at the Heart of Ecological Loss and Grief.* The Whig-Standard describes this as the essayists "...acknowledging our collective grief at the disappearance of nature as we once knew it." As yet, I haven't read this book, but it doesn't sound like a particularly happy or optimistic epistle. To a significant degree, I think we at Buck Lake do continue to enjoy the many benefits of traditional nature--fresh and clean air, clear and clean water, and a variety of wildlife seen and heard every day. We are a part of the marvellous and unique Frontenac Arch Biosphere where so much of nature as we know it is still available to us. We can easily be deluded into thinking that all is well based on our little corner of the world, yet we know that threat exists in a number of areas, and vigilance is required.

On the bright side, we have seen the return of Bald Eagles to our lake area, and after not hearing any for a few years, for the past two months a couple of Whip-poor-will have been exchanging their unique calls outside my home.

Through our Friends of the Lake Committee, the BLA strives to keep you up to date with lake health and plant and animal life issues that relate to us. I add with pleasure and gratitude that most of you appreciate what we have here and are diligent in taking steps to preserve it. With our past president's guidance, we undertook a fairly comprehensive review of the BLA's purpose and goals. This will now provide us with the platform for our continuing role as your lake representative. We have a strong Board of Directors this year, reinforced by extra energy from new arrivals on the lake. I am looking forward to serving as your president.

# Frontenac Provincial Park – Year-round access to over 5,300 hectares of protected wilderness –

This year's family education night hosted by BLA's Friends of the Lake committee took place on July 25<sup>th</sup>. We were pleased to have Ben Chabot, Superintendent of Frontenac Provincial Park provide us with an overview of the Park, a few insights into their newly approved Management

Plan and clarify some questions on Park Entrance Fees, along with other useful information.

At a high level, the purpose of Frontenac Provincial Park is to protect an outstanding natural environment within the provincial parks system and to provide high quality, dispersed, low intensity recreation. In order to attain this purpose, a management plan is created.



The Management Plan provides a comprehensive guideline on how

the park is to be managed over the course of the next 20 years. These guidelines are created with input from various important constituents such as the general public and First Nations communities. For further information, please consult

Frontenac Provincial Park provides visitors with the opportunity to experience backcountry travel rich in varied animal and plant species along with cultural history. It is centrally located between three large population centres of Ottawa, Toronto and Montréal and is within a three-hour drive for almost nine million people!

The central concept of the Park is called "Threshold to Wilderness." As such, its main objective is to teach wilderness skills in a semi-wilderness settings. For example, for those of you who have never camped before, the Park offers many resources to help make your first camping experience an enjoyable one. But Frontenac Park is much more than that: it is a wonderful place to backpack, hike, canoe, camp and observe nature – all year round! It includes 22 lakes, 48 interior campsites, and 160 km's of hiking and backpacking trails!

The entrance fee structure for the Park is incredibly appealing:

1) Per Day - Entrance day fees which allow day use activities and is based on bringing either a vehicle or canoe/kayak (and their occupants) into the park. If you do not arrive by vehicle or vessel, then you are allowed to enter the park for free – for day use only! Also, if you enter by kayak, then two kayaks (and their paddlers) can enter for the price of one!

2) Seasonal Permits – the various permits not only allows the vehicle and its occupants to enter Frontenac Provincial Park, but to enter any other Provincial Park in Ontario (that are open during said season).

Once again supporters of the Boatilla and Easter Seals rose magnificently to the occasion, donating over \$28,000, enough to send over ten physically disabled children to Camp Merrywood on the Big Rideau.

Included in that total was the afternoon's earnings by a little gang of kids with big hearts - the Hidden Valley Bakers. Members of this charitably-minded entrepreneurial troupe set up their bake table at the BBQ. At the end of the day they emptied their plastic cash register of its total of \$441.45 onto the desk of the Boatilla Committee's treasurer with the direction that every penny go to Easter Seals to send kids to Camp Merrywood. This year six members were front and centre at the bake table but several others have been involved behind the scenes in making the baked goods they have sold for three years running at the Boatilla.

The bakers range from 5 to 13 years of age. When they are not in their family kitchens, they are, in various combinations, out and about throughout the summer months, swimming in the lake and roaming through the woods and lanes of Hidden Valley. All good friends, some are permanent residents and others summer vacationers. There is no telling whose idea it was originally to create a bake table but it began with the children themselves. At the outset they had a fair amount of instruction and assistance from their parents with all aspects of the preparation of their delectable products. But this year, apart from some supervision and encouragement, they were pretty well on their own, producing their goodies in their homes with supplies from their families' larders.

disabilities enjoy for ten days at Camp Merrywood the pleasures they enjoy all summer long.


With these kids around, we old folks need not worry; the future of the Buck Lake Boatilla is in good hands.
