UNBELIEVABLE!!!!


This brings the fourteen-year total to \$248,077.78. This is a great community that opened up its hearts and wallets for children with disabilities.

On-site Sewage Disposal: A Primer

"Everything you wanted to know about on-site sewage systems (septic systems) but were afraid to ask!"

An Education Night sponsored by the Friends of the Lake and the Buck Lake Association Board.

Thursday, August 23, 2018 at 7 p.m. Perth Road United Church Hall, Perth Road Village

Speaker: Gord Mitchell, Public Health Inspector, KFL & A Public Health

Gord will give a practical talk about the set-up of a standard septic system, septic system maintenance and newer alternative/Level 4 Septic Treatment Units and their features.

He will also talk about how to decommission a system that will no longer be used and about the porous nature of limestone as a factor in groundwater contamination. Standards for septic systems are part of the Ontario Building Code (systems older than 20 years are under the Environmental Protection Act).

Gord will lead a Question and Answer session during which he will address your questions and concerns about your septic system. You are welcome to submit these questions to the Friends of the Lake Co-chair, Martha Scheinman, at mscheinman@hotmail.com and she will pass them along to Gord before the event.

We also caught 4 or 5 smaller ones this year.




Upgrades to Perth Road near the Buck Lake Boat Launch

At the 2018 AGM, Mark Segsworth, Public Works Manager, South Frontenac spoke about plans for upgrades to Perth Road near the Buck Lake boat launch. This issue has been of concern for boats, pedestrians and road traffic. Previous improvements for safety have included:

- the installation of rumble strips,
- parking further from ramp with widened shoulder, and
- reducing the speed limit to 60 km/h.

Mark presented a drawing of the proposed changes, an annotated version of which is shown below.



The highlights of the proposed changes are:

- Improve visibility in area by removing rock
- Shifting center line
- Widen by 3 m
- Increase parking
- Pedestrian walkway to and from launch

Mark stressed that it is important to consider all modes of transportation in this area including pedestrians, cyclists and vehicles.

To date, there has been lots of community input. It should be noted that this work will not be done until after 2022 and additional input is still welcome.

The culvert size likely to remain the same however it may just need to be realigned.

There were several comments from the audience that the culvert seems to be settling – need to make sure that culvert is structurally sound and can accommodate current traffic. It was pointed out that it is the height that is the issue not width.

Mark also mentioned that the Conservation Authority will need to be consulted throughout project. The current budget is \$2 million plus.

Following Mark's presentation, there was considerable discussion. Some of the key comments were:

- Visibility around south area of boat launch is of major concern. Is adding parking there going to help or hinder safety?
- Depth of boat launch from Perth Road to ramp is of concern. This should not be shortened, as it is already arguably too short.
- Will be looking at optimizing property that is owned by Township.
- Question: Should parking be kept on same side as boat launch so that pedestrians aren't crossing the road and cars/trailers can pull out of launch and stay on same side of the road?
- How is erosion stabilized? Concern with number of transports travelling through.
- Will parking be enhanced on north side of launch? Both sides of the road?
- Staging planned between 2023 and 2028 multi-facetted concerns that all need to be considered
- Shoulder paving south of launch? Would this help accommodate pedestrians? This will be considered more as improvements to Perth Road and not specific to boat launch improvements.

Next steps... take comments, information – preliminary design possibly next year. If you have any comments, suggestions or would like more information, you can contact Mark Segsworth at msegsworth@southfrontenac.net.
