#### **Buck Lake Kids Triathlon**

Plans are rapidly taking shape for the Kids Triathlon. So far the response has been great, with 16 participants registered to date. They are taking a few more participants so there is still time to sign up and get training. Below are all the details. Due to Covid-19 we, the Clarke sisters in the narrows, will be unable to host our annual Buck Lake Lemonade stand. In place of, we have organized and will be hosting the first annual charitable, Buck Lake kids triathlon, ages 8-15.

The Triathlon will consist of Swimming, Kayaking and Running.

This event will be held on August 23. The time slots for each age group will be announced two weeks prior to the event.

Participants will arrive at the top of the Clarkes house (1003 Wren Lane, Perth Road) thirty minutes prior to their start time. Participants will sign in, receive a name tag and be directed to their start point.

Upon completion of the race participants can be picked up at the Clarkes house and are invited for food and drinks.

We ask participants <u>not</u> to come by boat, as we will have participants swimming and kayaking. Participants are asked to drop off their kayak/stand-up paddle board/canoe and personal life jacket the day before the event.

All participants are required to pay a \$20 entree fee. All participants are encouraged to seek private sponsors/donations as all proceeds will be donated to CHEO (Children's Hospital of Ottawa).



## **Geocaching on Buck Lake**

Looking for something new and interesting that can be done around the lake and allows you to maintain social distancing? Why not try geocaching. Geocaching involves searching for a hidden cache using the GPS coordinates. There are several caches hidden on some of the islands on Buck Lake, plus many more only a short drive away. The map to the right shows some of nearby caches (the smiley faces are the ones we have found)

When you click on a cache, it will give you more details so that you know what you are looking for. Here is the description for the cache on Pulpit Island.



#### **Geocache Description:**

A boat-in cache sharing the island with The Devil's Pulpit...

This is on an island in Buck Lake, so yes you will need a boat (or swim, seaplane, skydive or cross the ice in winter). There are cool rock formations (the "Devil's Pulpit" as I grew up knowing it) on the West side of the island, but best access is from a nice picnic spot on the East side near "Old Razorback" (you'll see). Best to avoid climbing up the steep unstable west side. Placed with my daughter-in-law Tisha and grand-daughter Shea (who calls this "Puppit Island"). Fairly easy open woods on the island and decent paddling around it.

The cache is a camoflaged locking plastic sandwich container, hopefully well hidden enough to avoid muggles.

#### Rod & Reel Comes to Film at the Buck

This September marks the 30-year anniversary since the public broadcasting show Rod & Reel came to Buck Lake for some bass fishing and a shore lunch courtesy of the Original Friddle Company and the family behind it. For those not familiar with the program it was produced



in Northern New York State and featured the adventures of the very affable host Bill Saiff and his loyal camera man Wink Whitney. A Friddle, you may also be wondering, is an oversized frying pan/griddle that was invented by long-time and late Buck Laker Arthur H. Graves. The

company making them is now owned by Art's eldest daughter Susan Curran and her husband David and they operate it with assistance from their youngest daughter Christine Youngman. "Back in the spring of 1990 we went to Watertown, NY, to market the Friddle in a cottage show that used to occur there," recalls Susan. "We took our girls and went with my sister and her husband, Debbie and Orrie Michea who were our partners in the company at the time and who also have a cottage on the lake today."

A big event back in the day, the Watertown show featured a who's who of the sport fishing industry. "I remember meeting Cotton Cordell, the actual guy named that designed and manufactured all the tackle under that brand name, and we got two lures autographed for my brother that he still has all these years later," adds Christine.

Bill Saiff and the entire Rod & Reel team were also there, and he took an immediate shine to the Friddle and the nice Canadian family flogging it. He promised to come do a show on Buck Lake and help promote the business – for no charge. He just needed a place for he and ol' Wink to stay. That was obviously no problem, so in early September they arrived with a big shiny bass boat in tow and enough rods to outfit half the lake.



"Dave's brother Paul, he was a professional bass fisherman at the time, came from Toronto with his fishing partner Bob Formosa and brought their Nitro bass boat, too," says Susan. "There were three or four different guys who were all angling to be the one fishing with Bill on camera, but out of the blue he picked me to be the one in his boat; I remember he called me his 'guidesse' through the entire time on the water. He had a very endearing way about him."

The fishing was steady that day and resulted in plenty of

footage for the show including the largest fish of the session, which came out of the South Arm Narrows in front of Kevin Buck's place. Wink also acquired mountains of B-roll footage – generic shots of the lake and spectacular scenery.

"It was a rarity for them to have two bass boats on a shoot so they were able to get a lot of footage that they could edit and use later for other purposes," Susan explains. "Some of the shots even ended up in their revised intro the following season and they stayed there until the show was ultimately cancelled many years later."

Saiff was true to his word and split the episode between actual fishing and promoting the Friddle. "He interviewed my Mom and Dad at their cottage," Susan says as her smile widens and eventually erupts into a giggle. "Part way through Mom slaps Dad and scolds him because he said 'damn' while the camera was filming. It was great that they left that in – they really feel like they are being themselves even though they were so nervous about being on television. We all were, it was so new."



After the interview on Art and Shirley Graves' deck, Bill and Wink went back across the bay to Susan and David's place where they filmed Orrie cooking them their shore lunch using a Friddle on a gas barbecue.

"The crew and Bill stayed for the weekend after they finished filming and did regular Buck Lake cottage things," Susan says. "We went to the Sand Bar for a swim, showed them the Devil's Pulpit and osprey nest, stuff like that, it was like hanging out with old friends."



Once the show aired, orders poured in from the Northeastern U.S. and around the continent. "There were lots from New York and Pennsylvania, but then also a few from Florida and further away states like that," says David. "It was a great success for us. We also got piles of requests for cottage rentals even though that wasn't something we did – so I imagine if you had a Buck Lake rental in 1991 (when the show originally aired), you likely enjoyed a boost from it, too, based on how many calls and letters we got."

Nowadays Christine has used Shopify to set up a new website for the Original Friddle Company, the friddle.com, and orders can be placed directly online.

"It is amazing how the Friddle has remained the same great invention that my Grandpa dreamt up at the request of my Grandmother in 1968, but marketing has changed so much over the years," says Christine, who has a cottage on Porcupine Island together with her husband Colin and their three daughters: Claire, Emily and Ivy. "It is so much easier for people to find us now that we have a proper web presence and online shop."
