Nominating Committee Report

Association By-Law 1 requires the Board to conduct its business with a maximum of 12 and a minimum of 9 Directors, to be elected at an Annual General Meeting. Directors are elected for a 2 year term and can serve a maximum of 3 terms, at the end of which they are required to retire for at least 1 year before standing for election again. A few years ago we instituted a "rolling" system of Board membership whereby 1/3 of the Board would retire every 2 years. This is still theoretically sound and ideally provides for the regular introduction of new Directors and for a refreshing of the Board.

This year, despite the well-intentioned plan for a more regular and systematic Board turnover, we have to replace 6 of the maximum of 12, or 3 of the minimum of 9 positions. As of the date of this Newsletter, your Nominating Committee has a slate of 3 new candidates for election to a 2 year term. The slate will be presented at the AGM.

The following sitting Directors have agreed to stand for re-election to a further 2 year term: Peter Dawe, Anna Fummerton, Wayne Myles and Saundra Rider.

Current Directors who have 1 year remaining in their current 2 year term are: Crawford MacIntyre and Maureen McClellan.

Although nominations for new Directors can be made at the AGM, those who wish to serve or to nominate someone are encouraged to do so in advance of the meeting. Please contact Crawford MacIntyre (crawfordmacintyre@gmail.com; 613 273 8056) or any other Board member.


Coming Events and News Around the Lake
